Poroshenko Unveils Changes to Constitution of Ukraine Russia questions legality of Baltic independence

President Petro Poroshenko has proposed constitutional changes designed to give broader powers to Ukraine's regions. The law would trim presidential power over the provinces and give local government the right to oversee how their tax revenues are spent. <http://goo.gl/UZGD2O>

In the past six months, over 11,000 children from eastern and central Ukraine have received psychological and social support through a programme co-run by UNICEF, the Ministry of Education of Ukraine, National University of Kyiv-Mohyla Academy and Ukrainian Scientific Centre of Practical Psychology. The SBU has prepared evidence of what it calls "Russian aggression against Ukraine." The report alleges there are some 9,000 Russian troops deployed in Ukraine, forming 15 battalion tactical groups. The force includes more than 200 tanks, 500 armored fighting

Government has not complied with demands for reform

Ukrainian e-government initiatives progressing despite challenges

The recent spate of dismissals or resignations of high-ranking officials in Ukraine is a sign that the country's reform drive is stalling just 16 months since the EuroMaidan Revolution, analysts say. Those being expelled include Western-educated specialists who had successful careers in the private sector but who wanted to help change Ukraine after the corrupt Viktor Yanukovich fled power. The ruling coalition in Parliament contends that the officials failed to carry out major reforms and combat corruption. But critics argue that President Petro Poroshenko, Prime Minister Arseniy Yatsenyuk and Parliament share the blame for this failure. <http://goo.gl/CizYuy>
