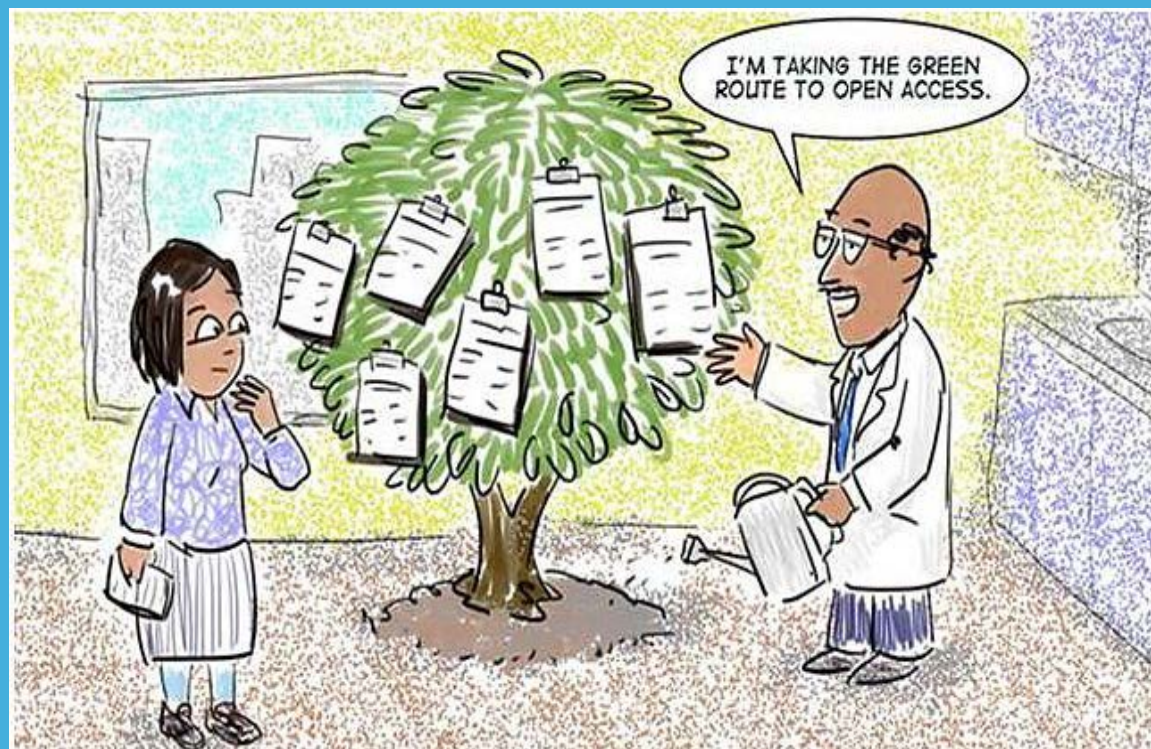

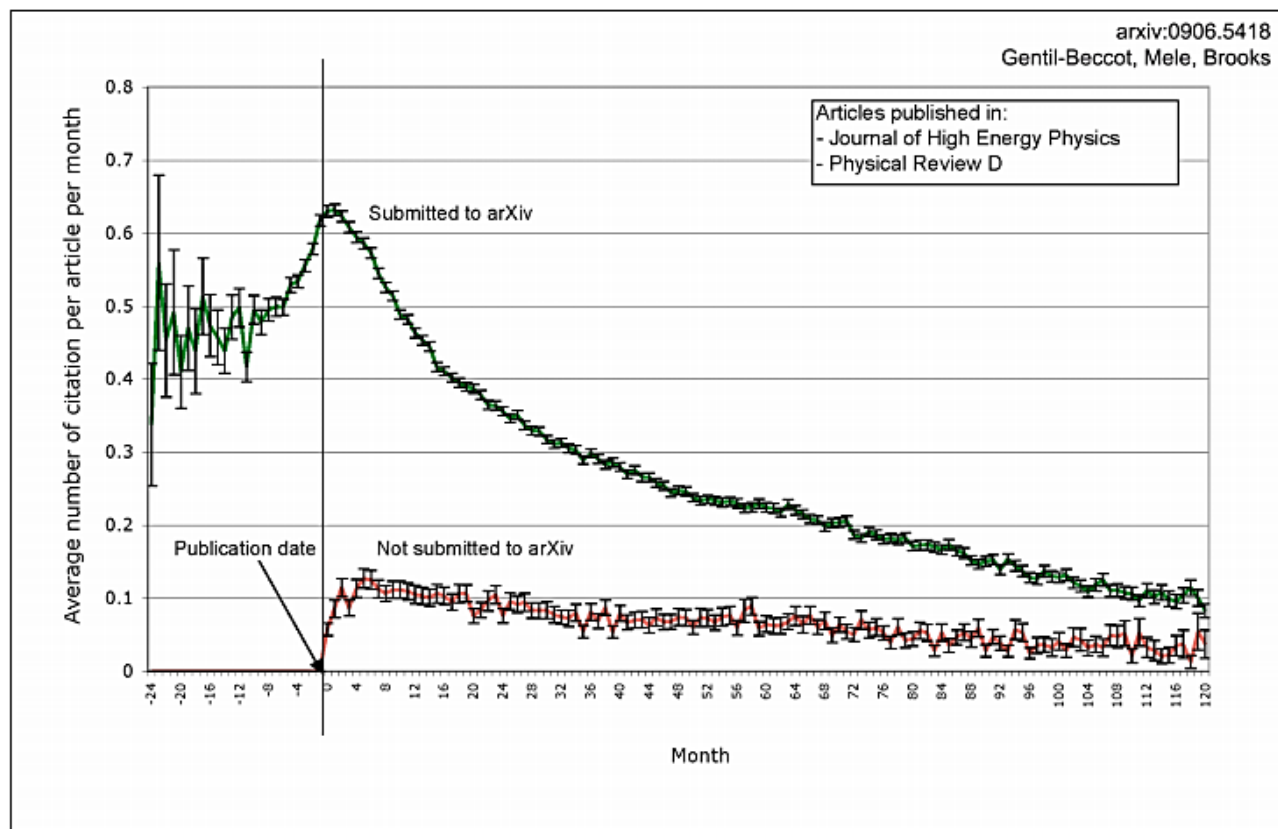
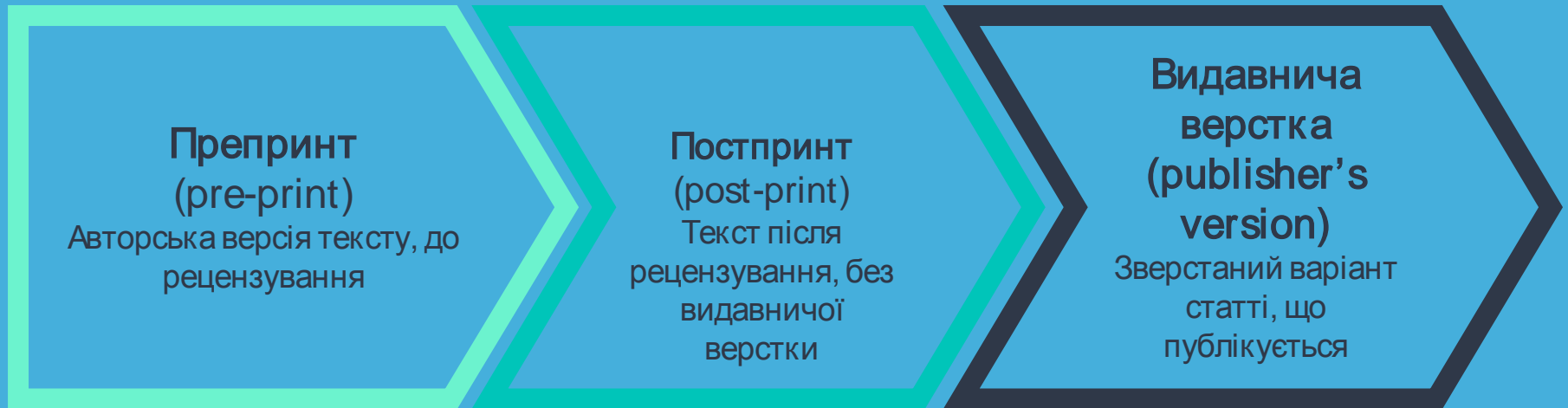


Figure 3. Average number of citations per article per month as a function of the time of the citation relative to the time of publication. Citations at negative times occurred while articles were in their preprint form. Citations at positive times occurred after the publication of the articles. Data is from 26741 articles from the Journal of High Energy Physics and Physical Review D over the period from 1998 to 2007. The vertical bars represent the statistical uncertainty of the data, and are calculated as $1/N (\sum_i (x_i - \langle x \rangle)^2)^{1/2}$, where the sum runs over the N articles receiving x_i citations in the same month after publication and $\langle x \rangle$ is the mean number of citations for articles at this time after publication.

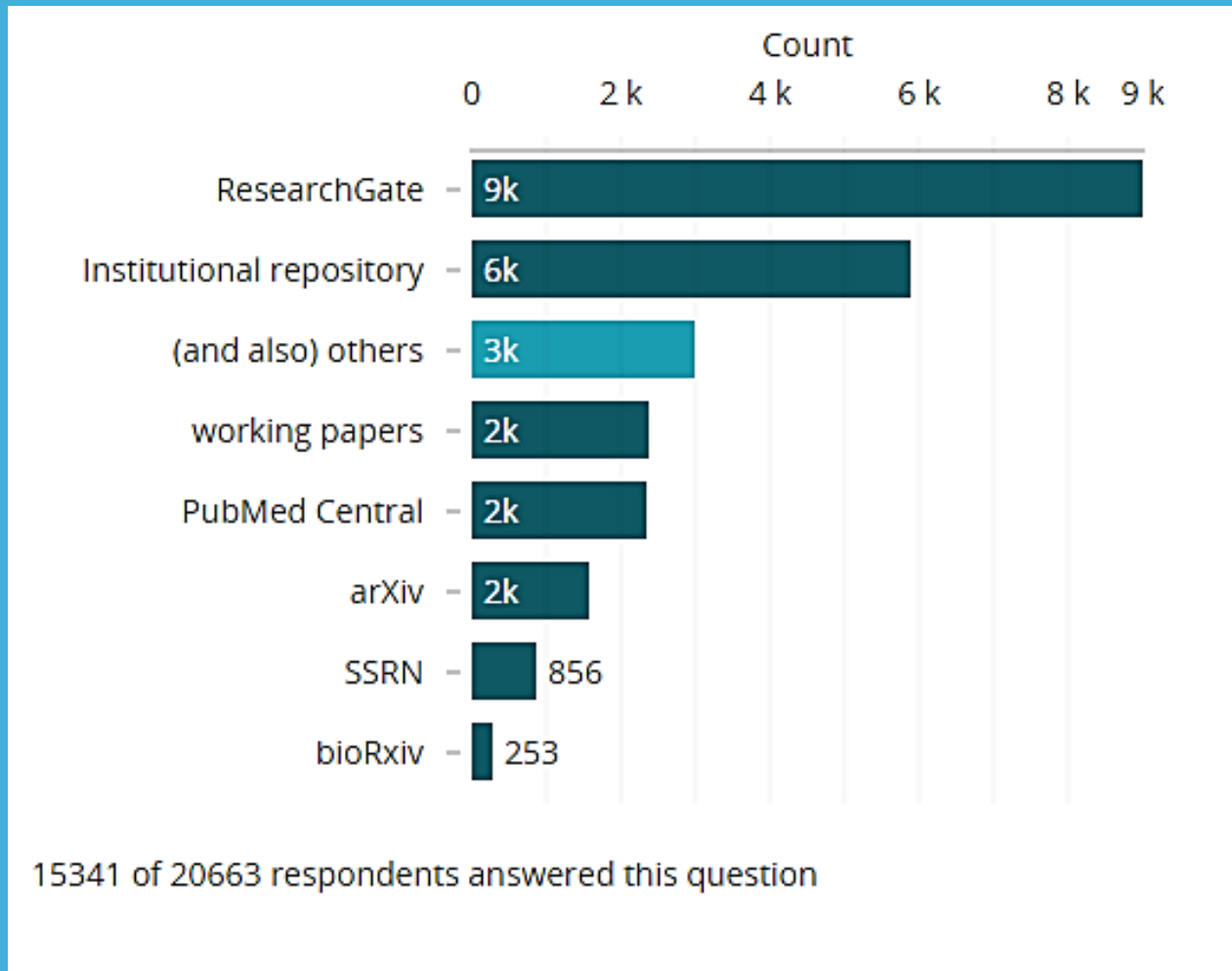

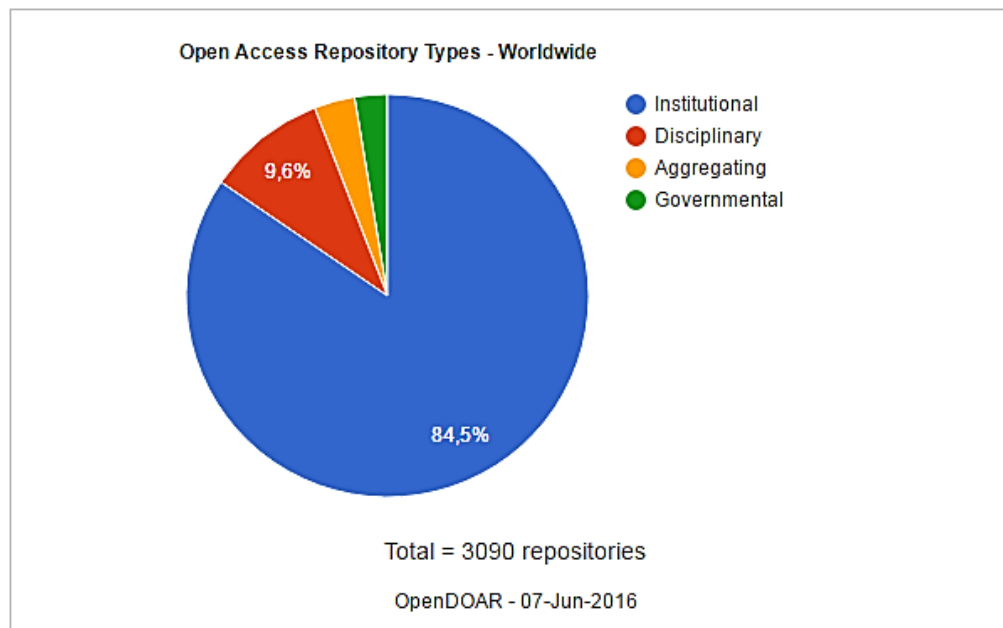
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Open Access Repository Types - Worldwide

Undetermined	A repository whose type has not yet been assessed
Institutional	An institutional or departmental repository
Disciplinary	A cross-institutional subject repository
Aggregating	An archive aggregating data from several subsidiary repositories
Governmental	A repository for governmental data

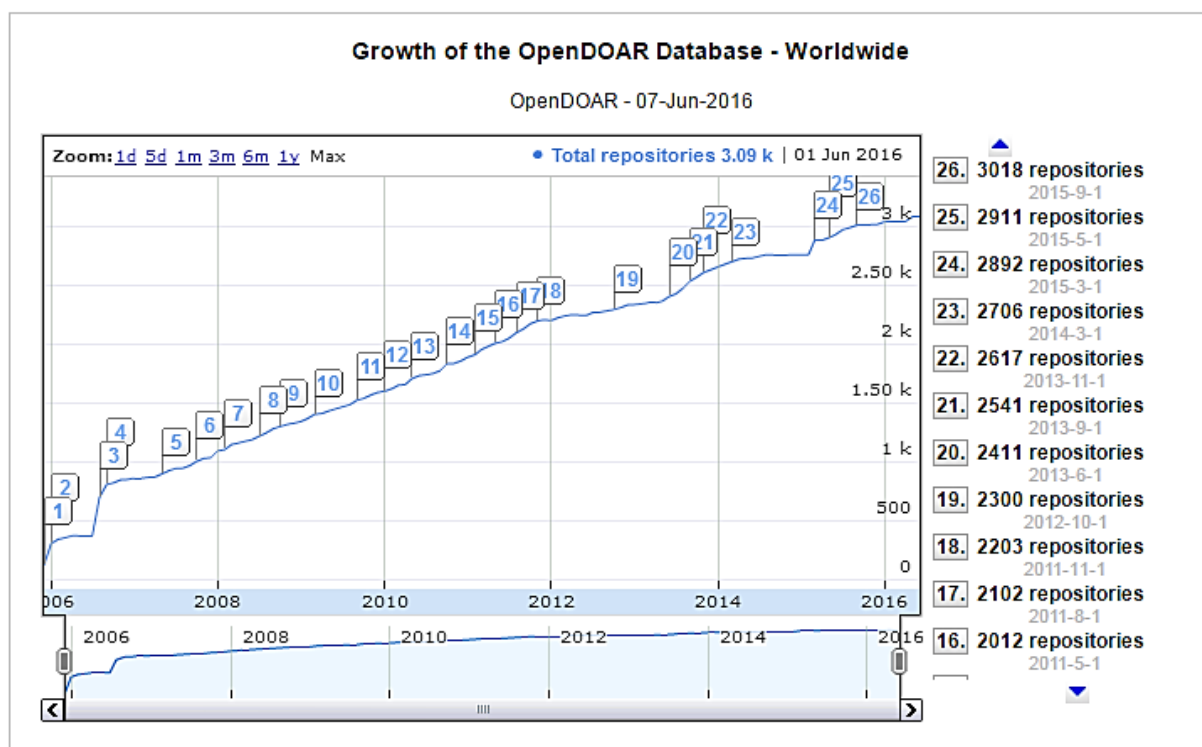
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Growth of the OpenDOAR Database - Worldwide

Типи політик

- Зелена – дозволяється архівувати препринти, постринти, видавничі PDF файли
- Блакитна – поспринти або видавнича верстка
- Жовта – архівування препринтів
- Біла – самоархівування не підтримується

ROMEO colour	Archiving policy
<u>green</u>	can archive pre-print <i>and</i> post-print or publisher's version/PDF
<u>blue</u>	can archive post-print (ie final draft post-refereeing) or publisher's version/PDF
<u>yellow</u>	can archive pre-print (ie pre-refereeing)
<u>white</u>	archiving not formally supported

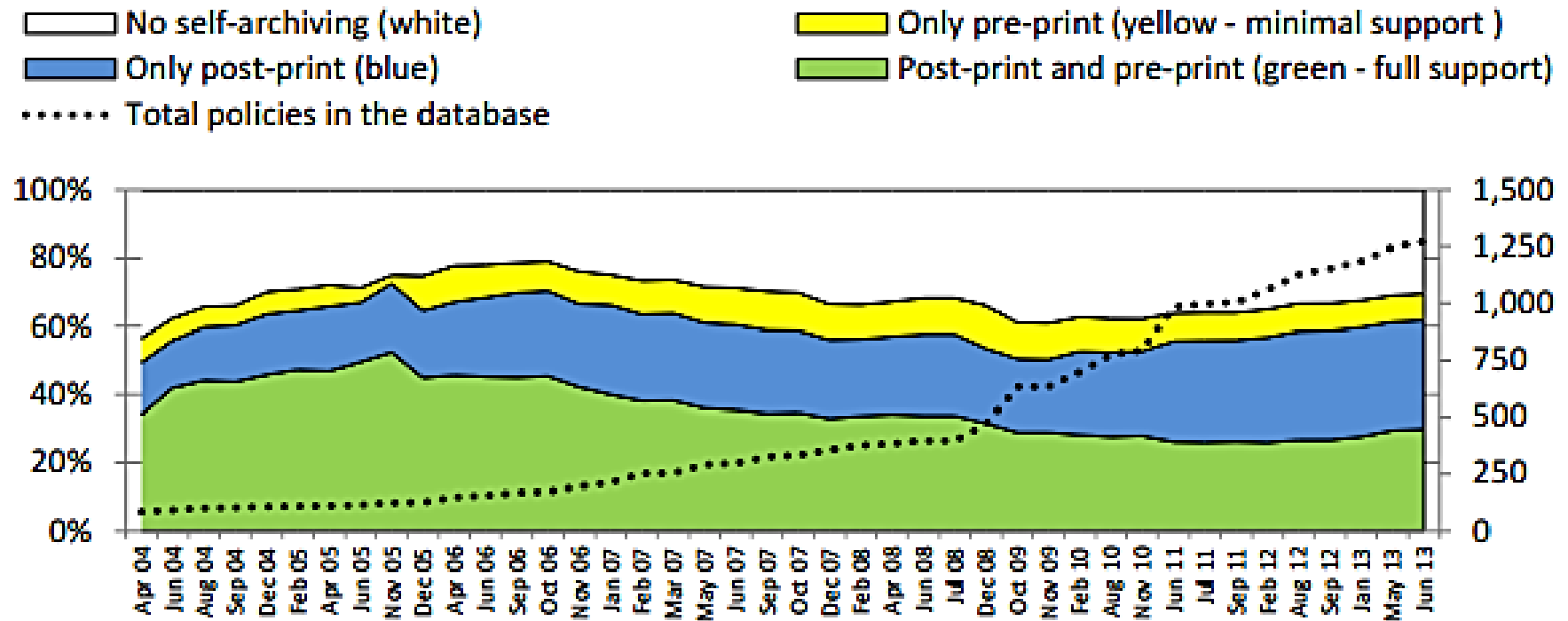
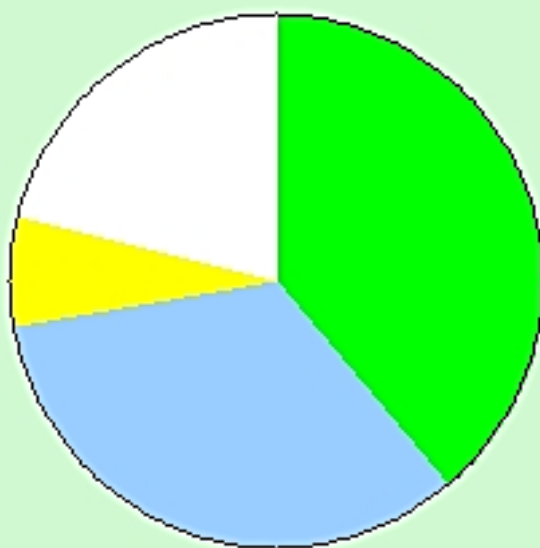


Figure 1. Overall publisher support for self-archiving from April 2004 to June 2013.

SHERPA/RoMEO Colours, excluding provisional policies

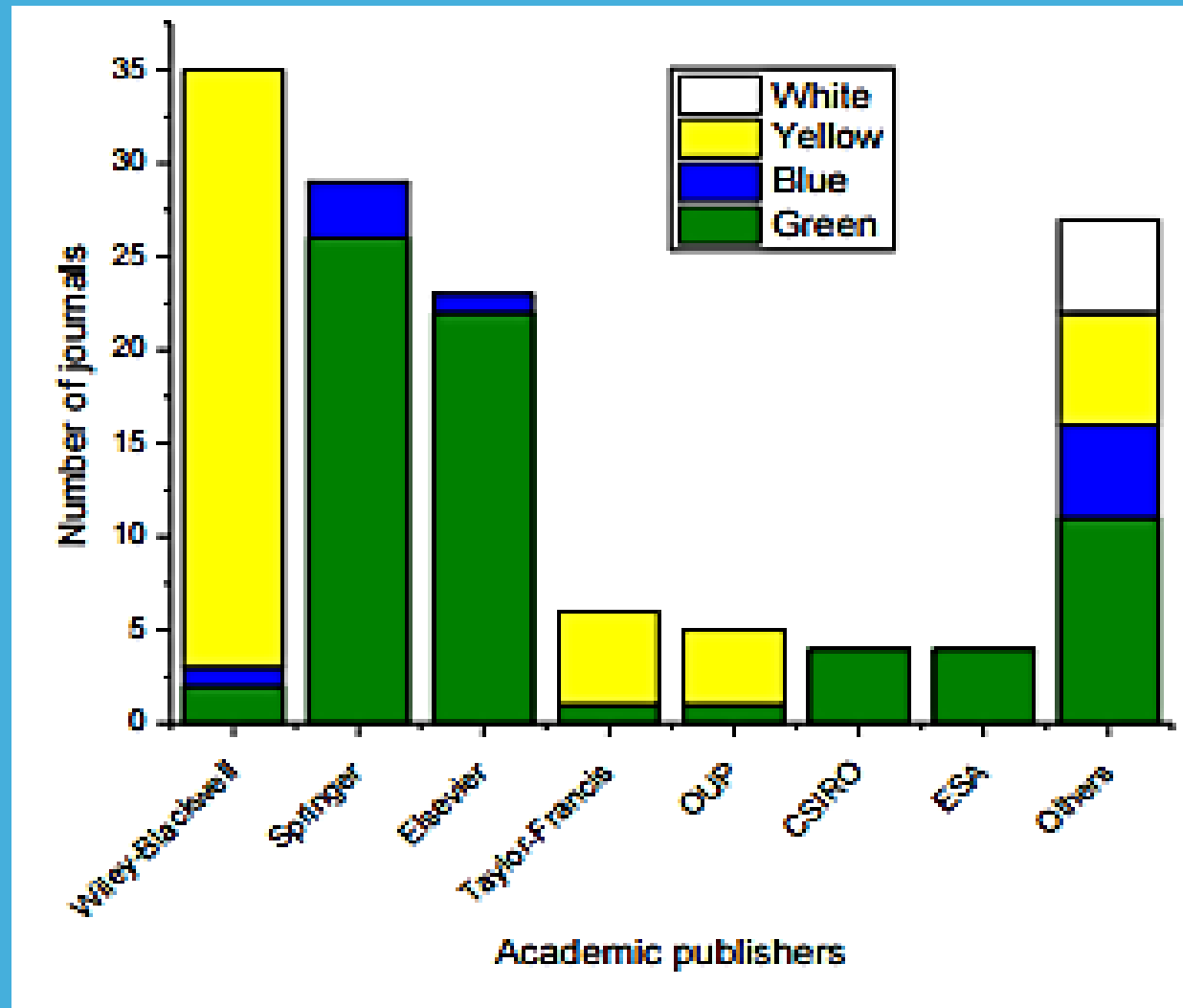

Wiley's Self-Archiving Policy

Authors of articles published in Wiley journals are permitted to self-archive the **submitted (preprint) version** of the article at any time, and may self-archive the **accepted (peer-reviewed) version** after an embargo period.




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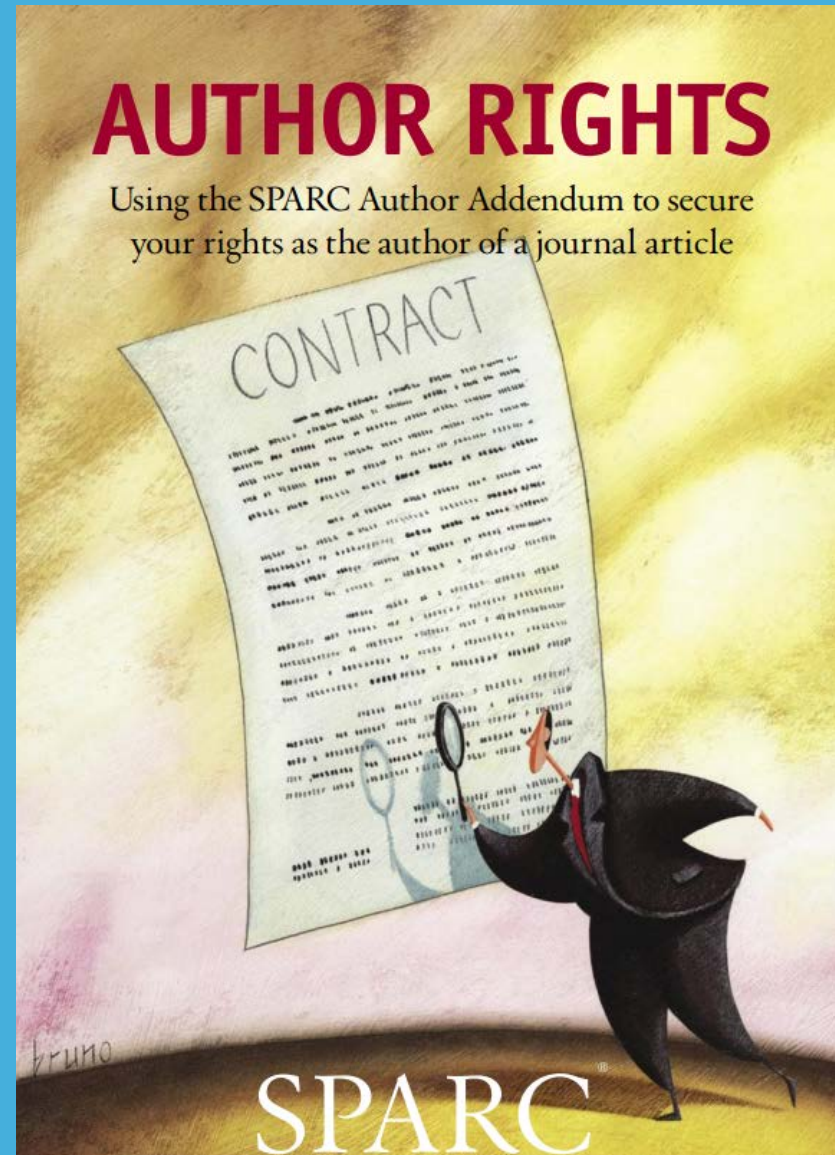
