The Ukrainian Rada is urging foreign parliaments not to recognize State Duma elections in occupied Crimea. The so-called "Crimean authorities" are forcing people to vote at the upcoming elections. Human rights advocates say local residents are frightened with dismissal and salary cuts.

A total of <u>6,000 Russian servicemen and 35,000</u> militants controlled by the Russian Armed Forces are fighting in Donbas as of August 2016.

Sep 12. Donbas heating up: <u>Militants increase</u> <u>number of shellings</u>.

Sep 11. Ceasefire heat: <u>Russian proxies commence</u> <u>first artillery raid in 10 days</u>. After short pause, Russian-controlled forces again using heavy weapon in Donbas.
