EU formally approves Ukraine Association Agreement

EU Foreign Ministers endorse favorable trade measures for Ukraine

Almost four years after Yanukovych walked away from it, the EU formally <u>approves Ukraine</u> <u>Association Agreement</u>.

European Union foreign ministers have unanimously backed a decision to grant Ukraine temporary trade preference for some agricultural and industrial products, following a similar decision by the European Parliament earlier this month.

Week overview: Rex Tillerson becomes the first high-ranking official from Trump administration to visit Ukraine. Kurt Volker shapes his idea of Ukraine through meetings in Kyiv. Jens Stoltenberg stresses that NATO's doors remain open to Ukraine. The Ukraine-EU summit ends with no final declaration. Russia shows its unscrupulousness to long-time partners from Siemens.
