This journey and our achievements along the way allow us to state with confidence that the National University of Kyiv-Mohyla Academy is better integrated into the world academic community than any other Ukrainian university, and that all educational innovations that have appeared in Ukraine after 1991, were first introduced in our university.

The principles we follow when developing our university derive from traditions established by Petro Mohyla during the early 17th century, and revived by Vyacheslav Briukhovetskyi in the late 20th century: innovation, high quality of education, honesty, distinctive corporate culture, and professionalism. All this helps us to integrate Ukraine into the world educational and academic context.

Traditionally, Kyiv-Mohyla Academy has been a territory of freedom—intellectual, academic and creative. Therefore, we consistently defend university autonomy. We believe that this must be the focal point for higher education reform in Ukraine.

- 2012 The decision of the Kyiv Civil Court upheld the right of NaUKMA to occupy the premises of the Brotherhood Dormitory, Prothesis, and the Hegumen's House (May 3–16)
- 2011 NaUKMA Senate awarded the first PhD degree in Ukraine to a graduate of the NaUKMA Doctoral School (November 24)
- 2010 Instruction № 1353-p by the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine officially transferred NaUKMA to the sphere of management of the Ministry of Education and Science of Ukraine (July 7)
- 2009 NaUKMA granted a title of self-ruling (autonomous) Research University (Resolution Nº 799, Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine) (July 29)
- Ukraine's first Doctoral School opened; western-style structured PhD 2008 programs enrol their first students (October 6)
- 2008 Consecration of the renovated Church of the Holy Ghost (XVIII). NaUKMA complex «Library-Museum-Archive» established (June 12)

- Kyiv Brotherhood School and Kyiv Lavra School merged, and Kyiv 1632 Brotherhood College established by St. Petro Mohyla
- 1615 Monastery, hospital and school for children of all estates founded on the inheritance bequeathed by Halshka Hulevychivna. October 15 is Official Day of the Founding of Kyiv-Mohyla Academy

The only western-type doctoral school in Ukraine. It offers 8 structured PhD programs. The NaUKMA Doctoral School cooperates with the University of Maastricht (Netherlands), University of Glasgow (Scotland), the University of Paris-Est (France), Ilia Chavchavadze State University (Georgia), the University of Barcelona (Spain), the University of Western Ontario (Canada), and the University of Bergen (Norway).

In December 2011, Mrs. Androulla Vassiliou, the European Commissioner for Education, Culture, Multilingualism and Youth, presented the first PhD Diploma in Ukraine to Hanna Bielienka, a graduate of the NaUKMA Doctoral School.

Post-graduate training in NaUKMA is conducted within the structure of Ukraine's traditional «aspirantura» and «doctorantura» and/or through structured doctoral programs that lead to the award of a PhD degree in a certain field, which conforms to the standards of the European Higher Education Area (EHEA).

The University Library

A coordinated network of 9 libraries represents a broad variety of resources that facilitate research and academic activities within NaUKMA.

All library resources can be searched and ordered through the e-catalogue and web-site.



«Kino-Teatr» Magazine is an illustrated periodical, analytical and popular artistic magazine—a medium between the Ukrainian public and processes taking place in the world of contemporary theatre and cinema. The magazine was established in 1995 by NaUKMA students, and is edited by film critic Larysa Briukhovetska. The editorial board includes famous film directors, screenwriters, and culture researchers.
