French lawmakers violate sanctions, law to visit Crimea

Any conversation about future of European security will have to start with Crimea

Ten days after journalist Pavel Sheremet was murdered by a car bomb in central Kyiv, the sinister, cold-blooded nature of the unsolved killing keeps hitting home.

"Any conversation about the <u>future of European</u> <u>security will have to start with Crimea</u>," - US ambassador to OSCE.


<u>Crimean Tatars</u> who have been abducted, and very likely murdered.
