
Ukraine:

Fighting in Donbas kills 68 children

Donbas <u>conflict affects over half million Ukrainian</u> <u>children</u> – UNICEF.

The situation in eastern Ukraine after two years of conflict "remains volatile and continues to have a severe impact on human rights," a new <u>UN report</u>: active fighting has decreased; but, experts warn that the <u>situation could develop into a protracted conflict</u> or escalate again.

At least <u>37 soldiers killed in May</u> in Russia's war against Ukraine. In May, about <u>180 rebel</u> <u>servicemen were killed in Donbas, half of them</u> <u>Russian</u> regulars.

Russia is <u>practising new schemes of military</u> <u>operations</u> in ATO area in eastern Ukraine.

Jun 6. <u>Militants launched 35 attacks</u> on Ukrainian forces positions. <u>Ukrainian troops repel assault</u> <u>attempt</u> on strongpoint in Mayorsk.

Jun 5. Ukrainian <u>positions at Avdiivka were shelled</u> <u>twice with large-caliber mortars</u>. Militant sniper reported in Pisky. <u>Militants deny OSCE observers</u> <u>access</u> to their strongholds. Jun 4. The pro-Russian illegal armed groups continue to resort to <u>more intensive armed</u> <u>provocations. A total of 49 attacks</u> were launched on Ukrainian positions.

Ukrainian Parliament Passes Judicial Reforms

Ukrainian Parliament passes judicial reforms.

However, changes foreseen by the law "On amendments to the Constitution regarding justice" have rather <u>ambivalent meaning</u>. Some experts have already labeled it a "betrayal." Others say that it is a big step forward, albeit with disagreeable points.

At least <u>5,000 out of 7,000 judges will be dismissed</u> <u>under the amendments to the Constitution</u> of Ukraine.

<u>ProZorro has already saved 1.5 billion</u> hryvnia, Ukraine's First Vice Prime Minister says.

The Ukrainian parliament on May 31 approved a bill to <u>cancel the obligatory registration of</u> <u>investments</u> in a bid to reduce barriers to the flow of capital into the country.

With one foot in the Economy Ministry and the other in the management of two of Ukraine's biggest state-owned monopolies, <u>First Deputy</u> <u>Economy Minister Yuliya Kovaliv</u> is poised to take the top job if she wants it.

Ukraine vies for <u>top honor in crony capitalism</u> index.

First deputy prosecutor general, known for role in opposing the reform of the PGO, Yury Sevruk, handed in his resignation. The hundreds of employees in the Prosecutor's Office to be laid off include those who live above their income and who

are believed to be corrupt.

New agriculture minister to focus on small farms.

Ukraine <u>exported almost 36.5 mln tonnes</u> of 2015 grain harvest.


