On 22 April the report "Russian War Crimes in Eastern Ukraine" was conveyed to the International Criminal Court in The Hague.

April 26 marks the 30 anniversary of when, in 1986, a routine safety test at the Chornobyl nuclear power plant in Ukraine spiraled out of control.

Apr 24. Situation in <u>Donetsk sector escalating</u> again. Three Ukrainian soldiers <u>were killed</u>. <u>30</u> <u>attacks in Mariupol sector</u>, six involve the use of heavy armor. Terrorists shelled residential area in Pravdivka. Church destroyed on Palm Sunday.

Apr 21. Ukrainian forces tighten their grip on Dokuchaievsk.

Apr 20. Three Ukrainian soldiers <u>killed in mortar</u> <u>attack</u>.

OSCE SMM: Militants pressuring monitors.

The first sector of "Yatsenyuk's <u>Yatsenyuk's Wall"</u> is completed in Kharkiv.

<u>20 prisoners return</u> to Ukraine from uncontrolled Donbas territories.
