Ukraine details requirements needed for elections in Donbas

Militants have violated the ceasefire over 6,000 times since the start of 2016.

May 23. <u>Militants attack ATO forces 31 times</u>, firing artillery and grenade launchers near Shyrokyne. <u>Militants fire 240 artillery shells and about 30 mines</u> on Ukrainian positions in Avdiivka. (report, map)

May 22. <u>Terrorists intensified attacks throughout the front line</u> in the Luhansk region. Stanytsia Luhanska checkpoint was fired on, and <u>Avdiivka was heavily shelled</u>. Russian-backed separatist forces fired more than 70 banned 122-mm artillery shells.

<u>Ukraine's requirements for elections in Donbas</u>: full access of OSCE representatives, withdrawal of weapons, voting by displaced persons, involvement of Ukrainian parties and media.

Azov Battalion marches in Kyiv against local elections in Donbas. Activists set off firecrackers but no clashes reported.

On the war front, Ukrainian soldiers feel abandoned.

Kyiv Armored Plant <u>developed computer-aided</u> weapon station for combat vehicles.

Ukraine's intel reveals how much cash <u>Moscow has</u> <u>forwarded to militants</u> in May (\$19 mln). Russia has also sent 35,000 blank passports to Donbas.
