Year's balances in the economy and the freedom of press

Ukraine's parliament has <u>approved a budget for</u> <u>2017</u>, raising its chances of securing more aid from the International Monetary Fund under a \$17.5 billion loan package.

<u>Naftogaz gets \$500 mln loan</u> secured with World Bank guarantee.

In 2016, the ProZorro system of electronic public procurement <u>saved Ukraine UAH 8 billion in state</u> <u>budget funds</u>.

Year 2016: summary for freedom of press in Ukraine. In the territory of Ukraine not under occupation, there were 262 registered violations of the freedom of press (as of December 27), which is 15% less than in 2015.

Year's balance: Ukraine's economy rebounds from its lows. After two years of a 10% drop in gross domestic product, the national economy in 2016 will report 1.5% growth amid a fall in inflation.


