### After 2 years, Nadiya Savchenko comes home to Ukraine

Documents emerge on Party of Regions' \$2 billion graft scheme

Former NATO Chief Rasmussen named Poroshenko adviser. Ukraine gains key ally while further frustrating Russia.

"One Ukrainian woman is worth two Russian men," commentators noted as Savchenko was returned to Ukraine and Russian military intelligence officers Aleksandrov and Yerofeyev to Russia.

Nadiya Savchenko open to running for President. From her first minutes back on home Ukrainian soil, defiant pilot Savchenko showed disdain for Ukraine's top politicians as well as Russian leaders.

Ex-President Viktor <u>Yanukovych's Party of Regions</u> paid roughly \$2 billion in cash to bribe both former and incumbent top officials, says Viktor Trepak, an ex-deputy head of the Security Service of Ukraine.

#### Russia-backed militants use heavy weapons

Russia is reinforcing military air forces in occupied Crimea

May 30. Three Ukrainian servicemen killed in action, eight wounded. Russia-backed militants use heavy weapons in half of the attacks.

May 29. Tensest situation reported at Avdiivka. Militants' sabotage and reconnaissance unit (SRU) attempted to intrude into Ukrainian soldiers' positions near Novoselivka. Increased militant shelling in eastern Ukraine brings new casualties. Five Ukrainian soldiers reported killed in last day.

May 24-25. Eight <u>Russian servicemen killed</u> and 20 wounded. <u>Ukraine army suffered big losses</u> at the hands of Russian/rebel troops – 7 killed and 9 wounded on May 24.

OSCE Chief Monitor to Ukraine <u>condemns violence</u> <u>against Special Monitoring Mission</u> in the east.


