On hunger strike for 97 days, Balukh in danger of dying

The health of jailed Ukrainian film director Oleh Sentsov, who has been on hunger strike for almost 40 days in a Russian penal colony, is "very weak" and deteriorating.

Jun 25. Sentsov hardly leaving his bed.
