

U.S. State Department approves 'Javelin' missile sale to Ukraine

Mar 1. <u>"Absolute truce" in Donbas was agreed</u> on in Minsk.

Mar 5. First hour, new Ukraine <u>cease-fire 'violated</u> <u>almost immediately</u>'.

### Ukraine emerging as global leader in open data arena

Ukraine moves closer to anticorruption court, but doubts remain

Week's balance: Stockholm victory for Naftogaz, Gazprom's new gas war, and major aid from EU.

Recent reforms open the way for <u>Ukraine to</u> emerge as a global leader in the open data arena.

Ukraine's parliament has <u>approved the first</u> <u>reading of legislation creating an anticorruption</u> <u>court</u> demanded by protest groups and the country's external backers, although critics charge the effort does not go far enough.

Constitutional Court <u>declares Kivalov-</u> Kolesnichenko language law unconstitutional.


