Ukraine formally accuses Yanukovych of treason

President has called for the Holodomor to be recognized as "genocide"

Yanukovych denies ordering Euromaidan shootings. Kyiv announces <u>formal treason charge against the</u> former president.

President Poroshenko has called for the Holodomor, the <u>Ukraine famine of the 1930s</u>, to be recognized as "genocide."

Three-quarters of <u>Ukrainians recognize Holodomor</u> as genocide.

"You are a unique example of courage, honor and practical mind," – Donald Tusk, starting his Brussels speech in Ukrainian.



<u>Disengagement of forces near Stanytsia Luhanska</u> <u>again fails</u> due to repeated attacks by LPR militants.

No significant change in combat zone over the past week. Ukrainian positions came under hostile fire from both small arms and heavy weapons. The tensest fights occurred in the Mariupol sector.

<u>S&P upgrades Kyiv to `B-`</u> on domestic bond repayment, outlook stable.

The <u>Cabinet of Ministers has cancelled 367</u> resolutions and regulatory acts as part of the government's plan for the deregulation of business activities in Ukraine.
