Ukraine under threat of full-scale war

Russia testing new weapons in Donbas

OSCE records escalation of conflict in Donbas.

<u>Ukraine under threat of full-scale war</u>. Russian-backed separatist forces to allegedly undergo rotation and be supplied with heavy weapons.

Jul 25. Three soldiers were killed and three others wounded in <u>fresh clashes between Ukraine forces and Russian-backed separatists</u>. The enemy enhanced its combat activity - Butusov.

Jul 24. ATO forces <u>killed seven and injured 12</u> militants in Donbas.

Jul 23. Seven government soldiers were killed in clashes with pro-Russia separatists, making <u>July the deadliest month for the Ukrainian military</u> in nearly a year. Groups of <u>militants twice tried to seize</u> Ukrainian troop strongholds in Marinka.

Jul 22. <u>66 attacks registered over the day</u>. Enemy subversive group repulsed in Marinka.

"Russians are testing new weapons in the murderous provocations they commit in Donbas," – NSDC Secretary Turchynov.

The <u>safety of participants of the religious procession</u> of the Russian Orthodox Church coming to Kyiv

from Eastern and Western Ukraine will be maintained by 4,500 policemen. Moscow Patriarchate's sacred <u>procession egged</u> outside Boryspil. Jitters in Ukraine as <u>politically charged</u> religious processions approach Kyiv.

Ilya Ponomaryov, ex-deputy of Russia's Duma and the only lawmaker who voted against Russia's grab of Crimea, confirms the Ukraine's that Russia's Special Service is behind the religious procession marching on Kyiv.


